for supporting Sexualized Violence Prevention and Response work

Violence prevention takes community effort.

Sexualized Violence Prevention and Response (SVPR) work is most effective when done in community. There are roles and actions everyone can take.

As Administrators/Management, you can do the following:



Complete the one-hour <u>Staff and Faculty Training on Deltek</u>

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Familiarize yourself with the Sexualized Violence Policy (BRD 25-0)



Familiarize yourself with supports available through the SVPR Office



Lead by example in meetings and interactions with colleagues - share/practice what you have learned and encourage others to engage with the work

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Share the SVPR provided <u>slides</u> in communications with your team(s).

Encourage your team(s) to complete the <u>Staff and Faculty Training on Deltek</u>. Better yet, incentivize it for them!

Engage in advanced training from the SVPR Office or external sources

Avoid prying and trust that your colleagues in the SVPR Office and People and Culture are doing their jobs thoughtfully and thoroughly if you receive a letter requesting flexibility for a survivor.

Know that you don't have to get it perfect and commit to ongoing learning: attend SVPR events and trainings, read about or listen to the experiences and needs of diverse folks
