

TRUly Flexible Objectives

- Improve retention and completion rates in key programs through flexible modalities of delivery.
- Provide consistent design and delivery standards for curriculum across modalities that align with provincial quality assurance standards for online and technology-supported education.
- Provide professional development support for faculty to achieve their goals in quality design and delivery for programs and courses across modalities.
- Provide a standard of student support in areas of learning methodology, technological literacy, and access to technologies and resources, so that learning is not impeded by modality.
- Increase education pathways for underserved and underrepresented communities through diversification of delivery.

Preparing for Flexible Delivery Why can't we start now?

- DQAB requirement changes:
 modality change = new program
- TRUly Flexible is to provide a framework for the guidance and support of all such initiatives to ensure we meet requirements.
- TRUly Flexible is rolling out through a multi-phase process to ensure we have this framework in place and can guarantee student success.

TRUly Flexible Framework in 3 Phases



Phase 1: Asynchronous course redevelopment. 2024-2025

Goal: strategic assessment and revision of approx. 135 asynchronous courses across 5 faculties



Phase 2: Pilot Project to develop select programs for online delivery. 2025.

Goal: to refine and implement flexible delivery design standards & determine scope of resources and capacity needed for a pan campus strategy



Phase 3: Pan Campus strategy for development and delivery of flexible modalities. 2026.

Goal: Use framework for a pan campus process for the design, approval, and implementation of flexible delivery

What's next

Phase 1. 2023-2025.

- Ongoing strategic assessment and revision of asynchronous courses across faculties
- Supported by program Chairs, Associate Deans OL and Instructional Designers

Phase 2, 2024-2025.

Pilot Project which will draw together faculty champions, members of an education design team (with support from LTI, CELT, IDs) to model a process for redesign of a program in an online modality.

• Through Pilot, assess questions of process, design and delivery standards, and resource and capacity needs for a broader institutional roll out.
