COMMUNITY PROJECT AGREEMENT ("Agreement")

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 28 day of November, 2017 by and between:

TRANS MOUNTAIN PIPELINE L.P.,

a partnership organized under the laws of Alberta

and having an office at Calgary, Alberta ("Trans Mountain")

and

THOMPSON RIVERS UNIVERSITY, having an office in Vancouver, British Columbia (the "University")

(Trans Mountain and the University are each a "Party" and together the "Parties")

RECITALS

- Trans Mountain and the University have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU"), dated April 7, 2015;
- Trans Mountain is seeking to expand the Trans Mountain Pipeline and in doing so expects to construct
 the expanded line and to operate the expanded line in and around the Trans Mountain communities (the
 "Expansion Project");
- The University has identified and confirmed certain projects that Trans Mountain could participate in, which projects are described in Schedules "A", "B", "C" and "D" (the "Community Project"); and
- 4. Trans Mountain has received necessary approvals to proceed with the Expansion Project.

NOW THEREFORE this Agreement sets forth the mutual understanding and intention of Trans Mountain and the University with respect to the Community Project.

- Trans Mountain's participation in the Community Project is limited to funding four bursaries totaling \$500,000, as detailed in Schedules "A", "B", "C" and "D" to the Agreement (the "Trans Mountain Responsibilities").
- 2. The University agrees that the funds paid by Trans Mountain in satisfaction of the Trans Mountain Responsibilities will not be used by the University for any purpose other than the Community Project. The University agrees to administer the Community Project at a rate not to exceed 10 per cent (\$50,000) of Trans Mountain funding for awards listed in Schedules "A", "B", "C" and "D". The University

further agrees that it is responsible for the provision, facilitation and implementation of a Trans Mountain Recognition Protocol as outlined in Schedule "E".

- 3. The University shall support Trans Mountain's reporting requirements related to NEB Condition 145 (Community Benefit Program Progress Reports - Certificate OC-064), as set forth in Schedule "F", by providing related supporting information to Trans Mountain and confirmations to the National Energy Board within 10 (ten) business days of Trans Mountain requesting same from the University.
- 4. The University shall indemnify and save harmless Trans Mountain from any and all claims, whether by the University or by any third party, that are connected to the Community Project, with the exception of those claims which directly arise as a result of Trans Mountain's failure to perform the Trans Mountain Responsibilities.
- 5. This Agreement is made under, and will be interpreted in accordance with, the laws of the Province of British Columbia and any suit, action or proceeding (a "Proceeding") arising out of, or relating to, this Agreement may be brought in the courts of British Columbia at the judicial district of Vancouver. Those courts have exclusive jurisdiction in respect of any Proceeding. The Parties hereby irrevocably attorn to the jurisdiction of such courts in respect of any Proceeding.
- 6. This Agreement, when executed and delivered by the Parties, shall constitute the entire agreement between the Parties pertaining to the Community Project and the Trans Mountain Responsibilities. This Agreement shall supersede all prior correspondence, negotiations, discussions, understandings and agreements (including the MOU), written or oral.
- 7. The University agrees that prior to making any public announcements regarding this Agreement, including a public announcement solely regarding the existence of this Agreement, it will provide a copy of said public announcement to Trans Mountain for approval, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

The income will fund \$10,000 in bursaries to full-time Foundation trades students in Instrumentation, Electrical, Millwright, Carpentry, Heavy Mechanical Trades, Pipefitting and Welding Trades at TRU.

All awards are based on financial need an students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.00 (C) or better. Preference will be given to students from Trans Mountain communities including Valemount, Clearwater, Thompson Nicola Regional District Areas A, B, O and P, Barriere, Merritt and Kamloops.

ADJUDICATION CRITERIA FOR LISTING ON THE STUDENT AWARDS & FINANCIAL SUPPORT WEBSITE

TRANS MOUNTAIN COMMUNITY BENEFIT PROGRAM

Trans Mountain is committed to a legacy of education and training opportunities particularly for those in Alberta and British Columbia communities along the Pipeline Corridor. Given its own expansion proposal for the Trans Mountain Pipeline (TMPL) and the anticipated growth in pipeline development in Canada, the program is intended to provide educational funding and training opportunities to support students in the trades, technology and environmental programs related to the energy industry.

The Trans Mountain Community Benefit program has three priority areas of investment that aim to leave positive, lasting legacies of the Project in communities directly affected by the construction and operation of the Expansion Project:

- 1) Community programs/infrastructure improvements
- 2) Environmental Stewardship
- 3) Education and Training Initiatives

RECOGNITION FOR TRANS MOUNTAIN

- Naming rights to a classroom in the Trades and Technology Building (10 years)
 - Trans Mountain has the right to name a classroom in TRU's Trades and Technology building. As such, a naming right would be subject to approval by the provincial Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services under the provincial Naming Privileges Policy
- Comprehensive recognition campaign acknowledging the gift including an announcement event, a national press release, website and awards guide presence, and representation on the TRU Donor Wall
- Annual correspondence regarding the awards, information on the student recipients and their work, personal
 letters of appreciation when possible, and the opportunity to present the awards and meet the student recipients
 at the annual TRU awards ceremony.
- Annual invitation to the TRU Presidents Circle Event
- Advertising the awards annually to students
 - Annual publicity advertising the awards on campus

ONGOING CONSULTATION WITH TRANS MOUNTAIN

- The initial terms of reference for the Awards be reviewed with Trans Mountain prior to implementation
- In the future, should circumstances change and cause the continuation of these Annual Award Terms of Reference to be inappropriate or impractical, the Board of Governors of Thompson Rivers University, after appropriate consultation may revise the Terms of Reference for purposes analogous to the original objective.
- Consultation to take place bi-annually with a Trans Mountain, or affiliated company, representative to review Terms of Reference and objectives.

SCHEDULE F

NEB Condition 145 Community Benefit Program Progress Reports (Certificate OC-064)

- A list of the participants or beneficiaries, including Aboriginal groups, local and regional communities, service providers or others;
- An update on the timing, status, and outcomes of each initiative, including its estimated completion date, if applicable; and
- A summary of Trans Mountain's consultation activities regarding the Community Benefit Program initiatives.
