Here are some questions you can ask yourself so that you are ready for writing a strong Letter of Introduction:

- What are the qualities you think make for a successful teacher?
- How have you demonstrated such qualities in the past?
- What kinds of experiences are relevant to this teacher education program? What have you learned from these experiences?
- When have you taken on a teacher role?
- What do you enjoy learning in your volunteer or work experiences?
- What will have an influence on the kind of teacher you want to be?
- How do you envision your future classroom?
- Think about two or three adjectives that best describe you in relation to teaching. Provide evidence.
- Think about additional information you can provide that describes you in relation to teaching.

By thinking about and perhaps writing short answers to these questions, you will have a good outline for writing a strong Letter of Introduction.

Your Letter of Introduction is very similar to a job application letter so consider reviewing information on the internet on the professional structure of job application letters and applying them to your Letter of Introduction for a polished look.
